PNC Arts Center summer schedule released today

Lawn seats, tailgating, seriously overpriced beer ... Ahh, the summer concert season almost is upon us.

The PNC Bank Arts Center in Holmdel will release its full summer schedule at 8 a.m. today through www.live.nation.com. Sixteen shows already have been announced.

The first show of the season, so far, is a May 21 date by the country band Sugarland, known in these parts as the band that joined Jon Bon Jovi in his first country hit, a slightly twangier arrangement of Bon Jovi's "Who Says You Can't Go Home."

More country music follows on June 3, when the Georgia-based singer-guitarist Jason Aldean takes the stage.

Teen pop will be heard at the amphitheater, too. Good-hearted Disney diva Selena Gomez, at 17 the youngest UNICEF ambassador, will bring her

bright voice and positive attitude to the arts center on Aug. 20.

Phish, the improvisational hippie rock band fronted by Trey Anastasio, has a two-day engagement at the arts center, on May 31 and June 1.

The box office opens for the season at 10 a.m. Saturday.

Numbered wristbands for the opening day sale will be distributed from noon to 4 p.m. Friday. The wristbands guarantee a specific spot in line for tickets. Patrons without a wristband will line up behind those with wristbands.

Regular hours of operation at the box office will be from noon to 6 p.m., Tuesdays through Fridays, and from noon to 4 p.m. Saturdays. The box office will be closed Sundays and Mondays.

Now 12 and on a different medication that she takes every morning and night ("It's about finding the right concoction," Kim said), as well as three inches taller, Madison said she feels "definitely the best I've felt since being diagnosed" and has learned to manage a chronic condition that has seen improved treatments over time. Currently, there is no cure.

She enjoys school, takes four dance classes a week at a studio in nearby Little Silver, and she is involved with a local support group for kids with IBD, even attending a sleep-away camp for kids with IBD last summer in Pennsylvania.

"Madison always had a great attitude about her situation but came back (from camp) with a much better understanding of the condition at the end of the summer ... and she made a lot of new friends," Kim said.

Perhaps the most fitting tribute to Madison's positive attitude and bravery is the distinction she soon will hold with pride — that of an Honored Hero in the Take Steps for Crohn's & Colitis Wal, taking place May 22 in Belmar. Sponsored by the Crohn's & Colitis Foundation of America-New Jersey Chapter, "the annual three-mile walk is CCFA's largest fundraising event," said Lisa

Champion, CCFA's walk manager. "Participants raise funds and awareness throughout the year and come together to celebrate the steps that have been taken towards a cure. Last year, more than 1,100 walkers participated and raised \$200,000; this year, our New Jersey goal is to raise \$217,000."

According to Teitelbaum, CCFA is "an excellent resource" that offers information and support related to Crohn's and colitis and helps to remove the stigma associated with "an embarrassing 'bathroom disease' that people don't want to talk about."

"Crohn's and colitis can be debilitating and annoying for both kids and adults, and as a result, a lot of people are probably dealing with it silently," Hoskins said. "But the disease is nothing to be embarrassed about. It doesn't define you, and the more awareness there is about it, the better treatments will develop."

Participating in the Take Steps walk in Belmar for her third year and surrounded by the support of her family, friends and dance teammates, Madison is excited to be cutting the ribbon to start this year's event, and she is firmly focused on the future.

"People wouldn't be able to tell I had it unless I told them," Madison says of her Crohn's diagnosis. "But I can handle it, and I try to think positive thoughts. It's just going to get better."

The Global Trigger Tool takes more time and resources than other methods, the researchers said. However, it could become part of electronic medical record systems, which would integrate it easily into the hospital.

Commenting on the study, Dr. John Birkmeyer, director of the Center for Healthcare Outcomes and Policy at the University of Michigan, said that "in some respect, their finding isn't surprising."

"Nobody is surprised that systems that rely on voluntary reporting

would tend to let a high percentage of cases fall through the cracks," he said. "It's not a surprise that a method based on careful chart abstraction by knowledgeable reviewers would do a much better job in tracking adverse events."

One problem, Birkmeyer noted, is that a system such as Global Trigger Tool can be too sensitive and may pick up unimportant things.

"The tool that the researchers describe here is a significant step forward," Birkmeyer said. "The problem is that this method may suffer by being a little bit too sensitive and throwing into one bucket too many things."
